NOTICE OF RACE

1. Series Organising Authority (SOA)

1.1. The series organising authority (SOA) is the North East & Yorkshire Youth Sailing Association (NEYYSA).

2. Race (Open Meeting) Organising Authority (ROA)

2.1. The race organising authority (ROA) is the host club as outlined in Appendix 1 for each Open Meeting.

3. Rules

3.1. The Open Meetings will be governed by the rules as defined in the Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS 2022 - 2024).

3.2. The rules and by-laws of the host clubs will apply.

3.3. Competitors should note all Open Meetings in this series implement the RYA Racing Charter and that they will be required to undertake to sail in compliance with the Charter, which can be found at the front of the RYA rule book (Racing Rules of Sailing 2022-2024), or at www.rya.org.uk/racing/Pages/racingcharter.

3.4. The exoneration penalty, and the Advisory Hearing and RYA Arbitration, of the RYA Rules Disputes Procedures will be available

3.5. Rule 40.1 shall apply. (See also NoR 16 and NoR 23).

4. Eligibility & Entry

4.1. The series is open to anyone under the age of 19 on December 31st 2022. Separate junior trophies and prizes are open to competitors under 14 on December 31st 2022.

4.2. Eligible boats may enter via the online registration on www.NEYYSA.org together with paying the regatta entry fee. Entries for each Open Meeting will close at 2100hrs on the Thursday before the Open Meeting. On the day entry may be possible if the entry limit is not reached on-line but is subject to approval of the Race Organising Authority.

4.3. Competitors who are under 18 before and including the day of the regatta must have a declaration form completed by their parent or guardian before they will be allowed to compete. This applies to helms and crews. The parental declaration form is part of the on-line or hardcopy entry form.

4.4. Entry to the series is restricted to mono-hull dinghies with a Portsmouth Yardstick (PY) number. If a boat's class is not listed, then the SAO will allocate a Series Trial PY number which cannot be appealed.

5. Change of Rig, Boat, Class or Crew

5.1. Using a different size sail than stipulated at registration of a sailor's first open meeting in the series, or racing in a different class of boat will constitute a new series entry and be scored separately from any races in the original configuration unless permission to change is requested and granted per 5.3.

- 5.2. Competitors shall register and sail one class of boat in the series. In extenuating circumstances, the Series Organising Authority may permit the use of a different boat in the same class (eg move from club owned to privately owned boat).
- 5.3. Subject to receiving a written application in advance of the proposed change and written permission issued by the Series Organising Authority, Open Meeting by 2100hrs on the Thursday before the relevant Open Meeting, a sailor may be permitted to change class or sail size without penalty at the discretion of the Series Organising Authority.
- 5.4. Helm and crew in double-handed boats shall sail together for the minimum number of Open Meetings needed to qualify for the series double-handed prizes. The Series Organising Authority may permit the change of crew in line with the following conditions;
 - a) The crew has started helming and wishes to enter the series themselves.
 - b) The crew is unavailable, and the helm has a temporary crew.

6. Cancellation

- 6.1. The Race Organising authority may cancel the Open Meeting or reject or cancel entries, in its absolute discretion, subject to RRS76. In the open meeting that the Race Organising Authority decides to cancel the open meeting or reject an entry they shall do so by 2100hrs the day before the Open Meeting to the affected competitors and shall refund the entry fee, less any costs already incurred.
- 6.2. In the open meeting of the Race Organising Authority cancelling their Open Meeting, the Organising Authority (NEYYSA) will post an official notice on the official notice board by 2100hrs on the day before the Open Meeting advising of the cancellation.
- 6.3. Competitors may cancel their entry up to 7 days before the open meeting and receive a full refund of the entry fee. Cancellation of the entry by the competitor less than 7 days before the open meeting will result in loss of 100% of the entry fee.

7. Schedule

- 7.1. The programme for the North East & Yorkshire Youth Travellers Series 2022 is shown in appendix 1.
- 7.2. Any changes to this program will be notified on the Series Organising Authority's official notice board.
- 7.3. There will be a briefing prior to the first race at each Open Meeting. This may be scheduled on-line. Notice will be posted on the series noticeboard by 2100hrs on the Thursday before each Open Meeting providing the date, time and location of the briefing.
- 7.4. Competitors are required to confirm attendance to the Race Organising Authority prior to going afloat.
- 7.5. The scheduled time for the warning signal for the first race of each Open Meeting will be no earlier than 1025hrs.
- 7.6. Each Open Meeting is scheduled with a minimum of three races with a lunch break. The Race Organising Authority may vary this format depending on local conditions. Changes

to the schedule of racing will be posted on the Race Organising Authority's official notice board at least 30 minutes before the start of the first race.

8. Entry Fees

- 8.1. Entry Fees to each Open Meeting are £10 per boat payable via the on-line entry system.
- 8.2. On the day entries may be made at the discretion of the Race Organising Authority who must be contacted by the competitor by 2100hrs the evening before the Open Meeting to obtain permission to attend the host club and enter on the day. If permission is granted then instructions on how to enter and pay the entry fee will be provided.

9. Official Notice Board

- 9.1. The NEYYSA website (www.YHYSA.org) will be the series' official notice board.
- 9.2. The Race Organising Authority for each Open Meeting will declare the location of their open meeting notice board in their supplementary sailing instructions and information displayed will take precedence for the specific open meeting. Where possible, this information will be duplicated on the Series' official notice board.

10. Sailing Instructions

- 10.1. Sailing instructions will be available for download from the NEYYSA website (www.YHYSA.org).
- 10.2. Supplementary sailing instructions for each open meeting will be published on the Race Organising Authority's official notice board. These may also be posted on the Series official notice board but this is not guaranteed.

11. Venues

- 11.1. The series venues are listed in Appendix 1 with their locations and local contact.

12. Courses

- 12.1. The courses will be defined in the Supplementary Sailing Instructions for each Open Meeting.

13. Starts

- 13.1. The black flag will not be used until at least 1 general recall has been signalled for each race started. Code flag P, Code Flag I or Code Flag U can be flown at any start.

14. Support Boats

- 14.1. Only official Open Meeting organisation boats will be allowed to launch at any Open Meeting.

15. Fleet

- 15.1. There will be one fleet for the series, unless stated in the open meeting sailing instructions there will be a single start.
- 15.2. A sub-fleet will be defined as the regatta fleet, this fleet is for less experienced sailors and sailors are able to receive on-water support to complete the racing (when available).

16. Scoring

The scoring system is as follows;

16.1. For each Open Meeting;

- a) RRS Appendix A shall be applied by the Race Organising Authority.
- b) A Minimum of one race will be completed to constitute a series.
- c) If up to two races have been completed, then a boat's score shall be the sum of her individual race scores. If more than two races are completed the boat's score shall be the sum of her race scores minus her worst score.

16.2. For the North East & Yorkshire Youth Travellers Series (NEYYTS) 2022;

- d) A Series result will be calculated for the 2022 series. Each Open Meeting will be scored as a one-day series, the series score will be calculated by taking the competitors' overall position in each one-day Open Meeting and entering it as one score into the series results.
- e) The series scoring will be as follows, this replaces RRS 90. RRS Appendix A does not apply.

Points Allocated In NEYYTS

- f) To qualify for a position in the NEYYTS area prizes a competitor must sail in a minimum of 3 Open Meetings in the same area.
- g) To qualify for a position in the NEYYTS a competitor must sail in a minimum of 5 Open Meetings, at least one of which is from the other area.
- h) The competitor with the highest score who has met the criteria in 15.2.e and/or 15.2.f will be deemed the winner
- i) For NEYYTS area scoring, the area assigned to each Open Meeting is listed in Appendix 1.
- j) The Open Meetings at Ripon SC, Filey SC and Yorkshire Dales SC will count as south area unless the competitor requests in writing to the series organiser that they count as north area.
- k) Competitors who enter 6 or more Open meetings are entitled to a discard for the NEYYTS regional series score. That is the best five results from all Open Meetings entered will count towards the boat's regional series score.
- l) Competitors who enter 4 or more Open meetings are entitled to a discard for the NEYYTS area series score. That is the best three results from all Open Meetings entered in the area will count towards the boat's area series score.
- m) If less than 3 Open Meetings are held in the series, all Open Meetings in the area will count towards the NEYYTS area series score.

- n) If less than 5 Open Meetings are held in the series, all Open Meetings will count towards the NEYYTS regional series score, regardless of the area they are in.
- o) Helm and crew in double-handed boats will accrue the same series points.

17. Outside Assistance

- 17.1. Sailors must indicate on the official entry form that they are entering the Regatta fleet which will receive on-water support (where available). This is aimed at beginner and novice racers who require on-water support to complete the race. This changes RRS 41.
- 17.2. Addition of Paragraph (e) to RRS 41: Regatta fleet competitors may receive information and advice from the official coach boat to assist them in completing the race.
- 17.3. Regatta fleet sailors who are deemed by the Race Organising Authority to be sailing to the main fleet standard will have application of RRS41(e) withdrawn, effective from the next race, without opportunity for redress. This decision will be published on the Race Organising Authority's official notice board at least 15 minutes before the start of the race in which it takes effect.
- 17.4. Competitors not participating in the Regatta fleet may request coaching feedback from the on-water coach after the race protest time limit has elapsed.
- 17.5. All competitors will display any additional markings or pennants as requested by the race committee to aid Regatta fleet competitor identification.
- 17.6. Addition of Paragraph (f) to RRS 41: For all competitors to; when a competitor is seen by a safety boat crew to be in need of assistance to permit them to return to the racing, the safety boat crew may offer assistance to overcome a manifest problem provided that the competitor does not gain significant advantage in the race from help received.
- 17.7. Participation in the Buddy sailor support scheme does not constitute outside assistance.

18. Prizes

- 18.1. Open Meeting Prizes will be awarded, as a minimum, to the leading competitor. Other prizes will be awarded at the discretion of the Race Organising Authority.
- 18.2. Series Prizes and Trophies will be awarded at the last Open Meeting in the 2022 Series by the Series Organising Authority.
- 18.3. Area series prizes will be awarded as defined in the series prize list on the Series official notice board.
- 18.4. An individual sailor may be awarded a trophy for North or South zone, but may not receive the equivalent trophy from the other area.

19. Communication

- 19.1. Except in an emergency, a boat that is racing shall not make voice or data transmissions and shall not receive voice or data communication that is not available to all boats.

20. Advertising

20.1. Boats may be required to display advertising chosen and supplied by the organising authority. If this rule is broken, World Sailing Regulation 20 applies.

21. Berthing

21.1. Boats may not be stored overnight at the host club without prior arrangement with the host club.

22. Measurement

22.1. Measurement Certificates will not be required at entry. All boats competing in the series are expected to comply with the spirit of the current rules applicable to their class. All boats are liable to equipment checks on arrival. The protest committee will be permitted to give a discretionary penalty for breaches of class rules, which may be to award no penalty.

23. Rights to Use Names & Likenesses

23.1. Competitors automatically grant to the Series Organising Authority and Race Organising Authority without payment the right in perpetuity to make, use and show any motion pictures, still pictures and live, taped or filmed television of or relating to a specific open meeting or the series.

24. Competitor Clothing

24.1. Competitors and spectators shall wear personal buoyancy at all times while afloat and using jetties. Wet suits and dry suits do not constitute adequate personal buoyancy. Self-inflating and manual gas inflated (offshore) life vests are not permitted. This changes RRS 40.1.

24.2. Sailors shall wear the bib provided by the race organisers if requested to do so.

25. Risk Statement

25.1. Rule 3 of the Racing Rules of Sailing states: "The responsibility for a boat's decision to participate in a race or to continue racing is hers alone."

Sailing is by its nature an unpredictable sport and therefore involves an element of risk.

By taking part in the open meeting, each competitor agrees and acknowledges that:

- a) They are aware of the inherent element of risk involved in the sport and accept responsibility for the exposure of themselves, their crew and their boat to such inherent risk whilst taking part in the open meeting;
- b) They are responsible for the safety of themselves, their crew, their boat and their other property whether afloat or ashore;

- c) They accept responsibility for any injury, damage or loss to the extent caused by their own actions or omissions;
- d) Their boat is in good order, equipped to sail in the open meeting and they are fit to participate; e) The provision of a race management team, patrol boats, umpires and other officials and volunteers by the organiser does not relieve them of their own responsibilities;
- e) The provision of patrol boat cover is limited to such assistance, particularly in extreme weather conditions, as can be practically provided in the circumstances;
- f) It is their responsibility to familiarise themselves with any risks specific to this venue or this open meeting drawn to their attention in any rules and information produced for the venue or open meeting and to attend any competitors briefing held at the venue;

26. Insurance

Boats are required to be adequately insured, including insurance against third party claims of at least £3,000,000.

27. Privacy Statement

- 27.1. The personal information you provide to the organising authority will be used to facilitate your participation in the open meeting.
- 27.2. If you have agreed to be bound by the Racing Rules of Sailing and the other rules that govern the open meeting (the rules), the legal basis for processing that personal information is contract. If you are not bound by the rules, the legal basis for processing that personal information is legitimate interest.
- 27.3. Your personal information will be stored and used in accordance with the organising authority's privacy policy. When required by the rules, personal information may be shared with the RYA and/or World Sailing. The results of the open meeting and the outcome of any hearing or appeal may be published.

28. COVID-19 Statement

- 28.1. By taking part in any of the Open Meetings covered by this notice of race, each competitor agrees and acknowledges that they are responsible for complying with any regulations in force in respect of COVID-19 and for complying with the Race Organising Authority's COVID-19 procedures. A breach of this rule shall not be grounds for protest by another boat. This amends rule 60.1(a).

29. Membership and Liability

- 29.1. All visiting competitors and supporters will be deemed as visiting yachtsmen at each host club and as such shall abide by the host club's rules and by-laws.
- 29.2. Members of the host club, their guests and visitors may use the club premises and other facilities of the club entirely at their own risk and implicitly accept that.
- 29.3. The host club will not accept any liability for any damage to or loss of property belonging to members, their guests or visitors to the club;

29.4. The host club will not accept any liability for personal injury arising out of use of the club premises or any other facilities of the host club, or out of participating in any race organised by the host club, whether sustained by members, their guests or visitors or caused by the said members, guests or visitors, whether or not such damage or injury could have been attributed to, or was occasioned by the neglect, default or negligence of any of the officers, committees or servants of the club.
